# Q3 FY22 March Quarter Update and Cash Commentary

Yowie Group Limited (ASX: YOW) (the "Group" or "Yowie") is pleased to provide the following quarterly update based on unaudited results for Q3 ended March 2022:

## **Q3 Summary**

- Q3 FY22 net sales of US\$3,602k, +18% versus pcp. YTD FY22 sales reached US\$11,725k, +36% versus pcp. YTD sales gains occurred in both the US and AUS markets and across all channels of trade.
- Q3 FY22 EBITDA\* was +US\$138k versus pcp -US\$96k, and YTD FY22 EBITDA of +US\$768k improved on last year's -US\$366k due to the increase in net sales and cost management.
- Net cash for the quarter increased US\$395k, comprised of the following: operations increase US\$349k and FX gain of US\$46k. YTD FY22 resulted in -US\$16k from operations and a -US\$15k of FX loss.
- U.S. Nielsen consumption data reflected a 19.8% increase for the 13 weeks ended 26 March 2022, continuing our 12-month year on year increase.

#### Q3 FY22 March Quarter Cash Review

- Net cash increase for the quarter was US\$395k. YTD net cash decreased -US\$45k.
- For the March guarter, Yowie reported US\$4,022k of cash receipts from customers.
- US\$3,673k was spent on administration, manufacturing and operating costs, net of interest received.
- Foreign exchange gain of US\$46k.
- The aggregate amount of payments to related parties and their associates in the current quarter cash flows from operating activities were US\$101k, comprising directors fees, salaries and superannuation

### Q3 Financials – Update

Yowie continued its positive momentum this quarter with Q3 net sales of US\$3,602k, +18% versus the pcp and YTD net sales of US\$11,725k, +36% versus pcp. YTD gains in both the US and AUS, across all trade channels, continue to boost our topline sales. US consumption has maintained positive trends over the past 52 weeks with a 36% total market increase, including gains in the strategically important Convenience (+59%) and Grocery (+36%) channels. Our largest US customer yielded a 47% increase over the same period. The improved performance is due to sustained retail foot traffic as Covid restrictions eased, increased distribution, and excellent consumer social media engagement and promotions elevating brand awareness.

Our AUS business continues to show strength in weekly unit movement in wholesale, convenience and large Grocery accounts.

Group EBITDA (unaudited) gain for the quarter was +US\$138k compared to -US\$96k pcp. YTD FY22 EBITDA stands at US\$768k compared to -US\$366k last year. Excellent sales results coupled with our continued focus on expense management contributed to the positive quarter. Margins remained healthy at 49%, despite the increase in material and transportation costs. We introduced a US price increase, effective late April, and an AUS price increase, effective February.

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#### Outlook

Q3 kept up our positive performance for the year and versus last fiscal year, despite challenges on a number of fronts. We continue to contend with manufacturing disruptions, freight delays, changing retail environments and significant cost increases in packaging, raw materials, freight and warehousing. The Yowie team has stepped up and met these challenges resulting in the company's best historical performance. Our stated mission is to achieve sustainable operating profitability and effective cash management. Critical focus areas include:

- 1. Keeping the sales momentum with increased distribution in both the US and AUS and offering effective trade programs across all trade channels. As our performance improves, more retailers are adding us to their assortment and more trade programs are available.
- 2. Focusing on innovation to grow topline sales and increase consumer awareness of our brand mission to educate consumers about conservation and endangered species, including, but not limited to:
  - a. New product development, both seasonal and flanker products.
  - b. Consumer digital engagement.
  - c. Brand licensing partnerships.
- Fiscal discipline and cash management by the entire team drives above industry margins, allows us to invest in the trade where appropriate helps, and has put us in the position to significantly improve financial results.

We are committed to continually evaluate ways to improve efficiencies, drive better margins, and build brand awareness. We also are committed to stabilize our product supply to ensure we manage not only our current retail business, but our anticipated growth.
